October 22, 2014

A Public Hearing of the Town Board of the Town of Lyndon, County of Cattaraugus and the State of New York was held at the Town Hall, 852 Lyndon Center Road, Cuba, New York on the 22nd day of October 2014.

Notice of said meeting was sent to the Mercury Gazette on October 15, 2014, with same notice being posted on the same date at the Town Hall.

Supervisor Kaluzny called the Public Hearing to order at 7:05 pm.

Clerk Puglisi stated that the Town Attorney suggested that when referring to the town superintendent of highways that wording be used thru out the whole law so the law now reflects that wording. Also in Section 4(b) put the word "board" between "town" and "upon", that was added to the law.

Resident Tom Schaeper asked if somebody in plain English can briefly explain what the law is doing and what roads it applies to and what is happening to those roads.

Superintendent Schneider stated that all of the roads in the town are going to low volume roads. He stated that it makes it harder for lawyers to go after the town. Superintendent Schneider stated that roads that have only seasonal residents such as Clark Road and North Center Extension will be looked at to be changed to minimum maintenance. Resident Schaeper stated so there will be no difference in the roads, a paved road will stay a paved road. Superintendent Schneider stated yes. Resident Schaeper asked will property owners be notified or warned that this will happen. Superintendent Schneider stated yes it would have to come up to a Board vote and they would be notified by certified mail. Councilman Hillman stated they then can file a petition with the Clerk to stop it. Superintendent Schneider stated everything is basically going to stay the same. Resident Schaeper stated it sounds fine to him.
